Scholastic Activities

The school follows the Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) system prescribed by the CBSE Board, focusing on the overall development of students. Scholastic assessment is carried out through Periodic Assessments (PA1, PA2, PA3, PA4) for Grades 1–5 and Periodic Tests (PT1, PT2) along with Summative Assessments (SA1, SA2) for Grades 6–8.

During the first term, Grades 1–5 underwent PA1 and PA2, while Grades 6–8 appeared for PT1, using diverse evaluation methods such as projects, assignments, oral assessments, reading, and recitation. The Summative Assessment (SA1) for Grades 6–8 was conducted in October.

In the second term, PA3 and PA4 for Grades 1–5 and PT2 for Grades 6–8 were conducted using various learning approaches like group activities, collaborative work, and experiential learning. The Summative Assessment (SA2) is scheduled for March.

Academic Activities

Art

Art Education in CBSE schools plays an important role in developing students’ creativity, imagination, and self-expression. It encourages students to explore different forms of art such as drawing, painting, craft, and design. Through art activities, students improve their observation skills, aesthetic sense, and confidence whereas activities like Diya painting and Lantern making, Greeting card, Wall hanging of Trianga colour, History of Indian Flag, mould of GanapatiBappa, Christmas Tree and Wreath, Warli painting , Rakhi Making.

➤ Literary Club

SMES School successfully conducted an Elocution Competition for Grades 1 to 8 on 5th, 6th and 7th August 2025. The competition was organized in three languages – English, Hindi and Marathi to encourage students to develop confidence and communication skills.

Students enthusiastically participated and delivered speeches on various topics related to patriotism, national leaders and the importance of Independence Day. The competition provided students with an excellent platform to improve their public speaking abilities, pronunciation and expression.

The final round of the competition was held on 8th August 2025, where the best performers were selected. The event was highly successful and appreciated by teachers and students alike, as it helped in nurturing confidence and language skills among the participants.



➤ **Nature Club:**

SMES School organized a Nature Club activity for the academic year 2025–26 on the theme “Protecting Nature Together.” The programme aimed to create awareness among students about the importance of protecting the environment and encouraging them to adopt eco-friendly practices in their daily lives.

The event was honoured by the presence of Vivek Dhuru, Ex-Deputy Superintendent of Vir Jijamata Udyan, and Manasi Warde, Educator from RESQ Charitable Trust, Mumbai. Their presence made the programme informative and inspiring for the students.

The programme began with a presentation on environment protection activities worldwide and the United Nations theme for the year 2025–26. Students also expressed their views on “My Mother Earth”, sharing thoughtful ideas about caring for nature and conserving natural resources.

The guests guided the students on the importance of potted plants in urban areas and how to care for them. Practical demonstrations on potting and repotting techniques were conducted, followed by a session on preparing a kitchen garden at home. Students were also introduced to different plants in the school garden, which helped them understand the role of plants in maintaining ecological balance.

An informative session on wildlife protection titled “To Rescue or Not” highlighted the importance of protecting animals and respecting their natural habitat. The programme also included a presentation on the success and achievements of India’s Chandrayaan Mission, inspiring students to learn about scientific advancements and environmental observation from space.

The activity concluded with a message encouraging students to work together to protect nature and create a greener and healthier planet. The program was highly informative and helped students develop a deeper understanding of environmental conservation.



➤ Social Heritage Club:

➤ Pre Primary Section:

The Pre-Primary section has thoughtfully designed a comprehensive annual plan for the academic year 2025–2026, focusing on the holistic development of students through a blend of academic, co-curricular, and experiential learning activities.

The year begins in April with a warm welcome activity and a summer-themed activity to help children settle into the new academic environment. In June, students engage in rainy day crafts, Environment Day activities, and Yoga Day celebrations, promoting creativity and awareness about health and nature. July includes fun-based learning such as corn chaat making and Green Colour Day, followed by assessments. August is marked by cultural celebrations like Raksha Bandhan, Independence Day, Dahi Handi, and Ganesh Festival, encouraging cultural understanding and participation.

In September, Yellow Colour Day, fruit salad making, and Hindi Bhasha activities (fancy dress and recitation) are conducted. October features Dussehra dance performances for Pre-Primary and Grade I, along with thali decoration activities and assessments.

November includes Pink Colour Day, Monaco toppings activity, and a poetry recitation competition to enhance creativity and expression. December is celebrated with Red Colour Day, Christmas activities, Meditation Day, and a storytelling competition.

January focuses on festivals such as Makar Sankranti and Republic Day, along with Orange Colour Day and assessments. In February, Blue Colour Day, community helpers activity with fancy dress, and Marathi Divas celebrations are organized.

The academic year concludes in March with White Colour Day, Holi celebration, Gudi Padwa, and final assessments. Overall, the annual plan ensures a joyful learning experience while nurturing creativity, cultural values, communication skills, and overall personality development in young learners.

➤ Constitutional Day

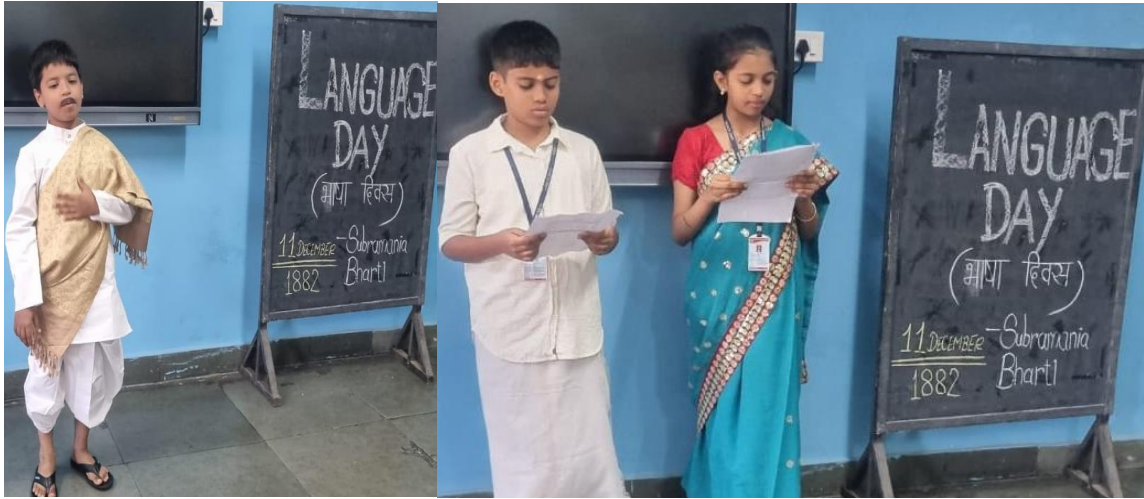

Overall, the enrichment programmes and competitions contributed significantly to the all-round development of students.









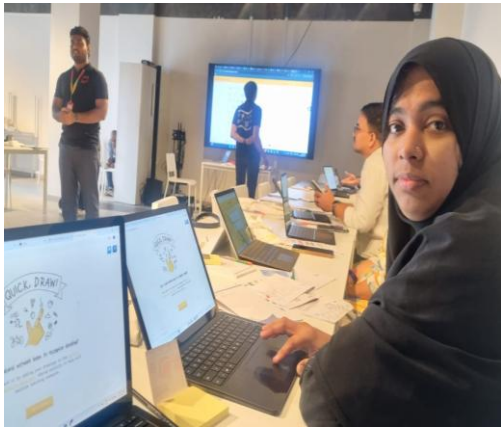
➤ **Teacher's Enrichment Programmes (Details of Teachers training)**
